## A WARM WELCOME

from Sonya Reichel, our Executive Director



2021 was a staggering year for the GTHS. Expanding our service offering allowed our organization to offer hope to over 3000 people in need in our community. We did this while simultaneously looking to the future and planning the path for continued delivery of service for the next 25 years and beyond. Together, with our donors and stakeholders, we sketched out a vision for the future, substantiated it with a sustainability plan and recruited a team of community leaders to bring our dream to life.

Two themes were undeniable in 2021; the first, that pets improve the health and wellness of people. With mental health challenges on the rise and isolation continuing to fragment society, pets have facilitated life improving wellness outcomes for hundreds of community members. The second, was that when food insecurity or access to housing affects a household, pets are impacted too. Now, more than ever, our community needs greater access to veterinary care, emergency services and behavioural resources and the GTHS has the programs in place to respond.

Finally, in 2021, the GTHS Board of Directors put a stake in the ground. Our greatest challenge and risk for the future is our urgent need for capital expansion. We are urgently in need of a new home and will be building a Regional Centre for Pets and People to serve our community for the next several decades. Read about our progress towards this goal in this report.

As always, this Impact Report is addressed directly to you, our donors. The stories we share are your stories. The statistics and progress are directly a result of your investment in our mission. I think of even greater note are the results we have had against the backdrop of Covid-19 and the limitations of our small facility. We have used 'out of the box' thinking to remove barriers and change lives. Together, we are building for impact to realize a brighter future for those most vulnerable in our community.

### This is Beans! -

After arriving at GTHS, in May 2021, with an unknown prognosis and quality of life, Beans, the little kitten that could, just celebrated his first birthday. Diagnosed with thoracic hemivertebrae (deformed vertebrae) Beans has about 80% use of his back legs. Beans is a persistent cat who hasn't let anything come in the way of his will to LIVE fully. This lucky boy was adopted by his amazing foster family!

## THE NEED FOR THE WORK OF THE GTHS

The Georgian Triangle Humane Society believes in a better world for pets and people, a reality where our dreams of accessible animal care and the eradication of animal homelessness and food insecurity are possible. Together, with you our donors, we are changing lives and offering hope.

Our world is changing. Inflation is the highest it has been since 1991. Over 5.7 million Canadians are facing food insecurity, while close to half of Canadians are living pay cheque to pay cheque, barely making ends meet – a less visible form of homelessness. What does this mean for our most vulnerable, the animals that rely on us, whose whole world is their home and their family? It means that they all need us more than ever. The response and success of our programming continues to grow:

- Animal companionship through adoption
- Accessible spay & neuter services through the GTHS Animal Hospital for financially limited families, community and barn cats
- Improving the wellness of pets and people through accessible rabies and microchip clinics, emergency medical assistance and emergency board programs, and the pet pantry
- Improvement of mental health for youth through Humane Education

You are offering hope during times of emergency and distress. You are keeping families together. You are being a voice for the voiceless.

The GTHS receives no government funding and relies on the generosity of donors and the funds raised through campaigns and events. You, our donors, are the reason this is all possible. You keep our lights on, doors open and programs running.





### **WALKATHON**

Walkathon Week took place from June 20th to 26th with 111 registrants, 30 teams and all their furry companions! They championed the GTHS by walking, hiking, biking, swimming, running, and kayaking. Together, we raised a record-breaking \$130,262, far exceeding the fundraising goal by 30 percent.

## THE GTHS HOSPITAL

The GTHS Animal Hospital spayed and neutered over 1,540 vulnerable pets in our community, subsidizing \$553,500 in veterinary costs.

The hospital team hosted ten community cat spay & neuter days, fixing 160 cats. This service, funded by donors and municipal grants, prevented 1,920 cats from being born on rural properties and in outdoor settings making measurable impacts towards our strategic goal of reducing cat overpopulation.

### **PET PANTRY**

We know that 8.8% of Canadian households experience food insecurity and that when a family struggles to put food on the table, pets are impacted too. This year, the GTHS offered support to 317 pets through our Pet Pantry service.



### **FOSTER PROGRAM**

## OVER 500 HOMELESS KITTENS ARRIVE AT THE ANIMAL CENTRE EVERY YEAR

GTHS foster volunteers are the foundation of this program, dedicating time, resources and compassion to pets in need. Of the 441 cats and 182 dogs fostered, the majority were kittens or puppies, too young to safely enter the shelter environment. These dedicated volunteers **fostered a total of 623 animals, almost 300 more than in 2020**.

## **TRANSFER PROGRAM**

Working collaboratively with volunteers, donors and rescue partners, the GTHS runs an animal transfer program that focuses on working together, predominately with Northern communities. In 2021, 252 dogs and 118 cats were transferred as part of this program to find loving adoptive homes.

## **IMPROVING MENTAL HEALTH**

1,200 youth from our community were impacted through online GTHS Humane Education programs. Thanks to your donations, the GTHS was able to fully develop and launch a brand-new online program entitled Vets of Tomorrow part I (part II set to be released in 2022). Vets of Tomorrow is designed for secondary school students ages 11-18. This course has two wellness goals for youth; to arm them with the skills necessary to make knowledgeable career choices and to improve their mental health through the development of their emotional and social skill learning.



## STORIES OF IMPACT FANCY

"In February of 2021 the GTHS saved my cat, Fancy, which gave me the kick I needed to start a business. She had a bad bladder stone, and I was hit with an unexpected \$2,000 surgery bill. I didn't know if I could afford to save her since that was more than my mortgage! GTHS was able to help us through the Emergency Medical Assistance Program to help fund a portion of her surgery. Fancy has been healthy and happy ever since.

That experience gave me the revelation that I needed to make extra income to save for emergencies while building our future. I started a side hustle which turned into my fulltime business by May. I haven't looked back since and am so grateful for where this journey took us."





## **PEARL**

A couple days before Christmas, Pearl's family lost their home in a devastating fire. Pearl was the only one out of their three pets that was able to be saved. Pearl was unconscious when she was pulled out of the house but thankfully the firefighters were able to resuscitate her. Pearl's family left their home with only her, the clothes on their backs, and the mom's purse. They had lost everything.

Unfortunately, later that day Pearl was rushed to an emergency veterinary clinic with smoke inhalation complications. The mom gave the only money she had in her purse and begged them to save her. Through the GTHS Emergency Medical Assistance Program, funded by our donors, Pearl's medical bills were paid, and her life was, once again, saved.

Pearl's family is SO thankful and happy to share her story of survival!





## **PERCY**

Percy arrived at GTHS as an emergency medical case with an urgent need for surgery for a prolapsed rectum. Even after his corrective surgery, performed at the GTHS Animal Hospital, his prognosis was uncertain.

Although the surgery went well, Percy's recovery was difficult, especially as a young pup. While healing he experienced extreme discomfort but that discomfort didn't stop him from being his silly, goofy self. He continued to make people laugh and demand all the love and affection from staff and volunteers. It wasn't until about a month post-op that he was finally given the all-clear by our medical team and he quickly captured the hearts of an amazing family! He has been in his home for almost a whole year now and is happy, healthy and thriving.

### **ARYA**

Arya took the GTHS Pet Sitter Course in 2021 and since then has taken every single virtual course we have to offer. She has had such an amazing experience she has turned her passion for pets and people into her very own business.



## OUR NEED FOR A NEW HOME

In 2021, the GTHS launched a capital campaign with the goal of raising funds to build a much-needed animal care and community-focused centre. Years in the making, the launch of this campaign was the culmination of hard work, collaboration, unyielding hope and represents a pivotal moment in GTHS history.

The campaign got off to a phenomenal start in 2021 thanks to donations from GTHS family. Board members, volunteers, donors, and staff contributed a total of \$2,217,974 in pledges towards the new facility. The team are looking forward to continuing this progress with the Quiet Phase of fundraising which will run into 2023.

The GTHS team are deeply grateful to you, our trailblazing donors, for providing the initial funding for this project.

In 2025, the Regional Centre for Pets and People will open its doors. The centre will provide advanced medical care and shelter to animals in need. It will place more animals into safe, loving homes. Accessible, community-focused programs will provide hope and safety to vulnerable members of the community. At-risk youth will find purpose and belonging through educational programming and volunteer opportunities. The centre will be an essential community resource, offering safety, comfort, and warmth: a home to both pets and people of the community.




